Suggested supplies:

(Supplies can be purchased at Hobby Lobby, Blenders, Cheapjoes.com, etc.)

Acrylics:

Minimum for the class: a startup kit or simply red, yellow, blue, white and black, dioxazine purple, burnt sienna.

Bring other shades you like and you can mix the rest. Liquitex and Golden are great brands, but pricey. They are nice to use for the top coat. Other brands are fine to get started.

Assorted brushes:

Minimum for the class: One small, medium, and large brush.

It's helpful to have a variety of flat and round brushes and a 2 inch brush for backgrounds. (I will have extras, as well)

Easel:

Bring a table easel or free standing easel if you have one, but I will have extras on hand. Email me at janice@jvcartworks.com to reserve one.

Canvas:

Minimum for the class: Two stretched or flat canvas or canvas board 16x20 or larger. You may also paint on watercolor paper.

Palettes

Minimum for the class: A few paper plates. Plastic or glass plates are even better to keep paint wet.

Water jars

Minimum for the class: At least two plastic cups or glass jars

Optional supplies, but great to have:

Gloss:

Medium and/or matte medium (Liquitex makes a great one)

Small bottle of Liquitex iridescent liquid medium (you'll LOVE what this does!) hard to find and not mandatory

A few metallics (small) gold, silver, copper, etc.

Glitter glue (Hobby Lobby has a bunch of shades.) Pick one or more

Other miscellaneous items:

paint clothes and/or an apron

spray bottle for water (mist)

drinking bottle to refill

spotlight for easel (Home Depot has an inexpensive light weight one that clamps on)

tarps(plastic tablecloths work)

plastic gloves

Optional assignment to help you prepare for the workshop

Start an art journal with a sketch a day of anything you are drawn to. Write any dreams, visions, ideas that come to mind. Start with pencil and work into color. Soft pastels and oil pastels work great for vibrancy.
